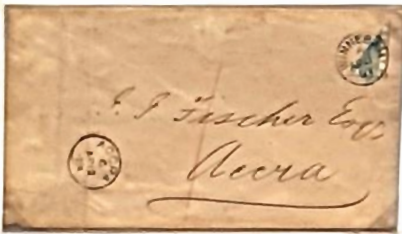

 possibility of a 1/2d. rate between Africa and Africa
 to the west, taking all intermediate points on the coast.
 This service was carried on by relay of runners followed all various
 centres and this cover would have been carried on the return service.

 18/12). Adhesive cancelled with blue EUMWA AP 24 90 and in
 the same colour. Red crayon indicates Ad. to British P.O.
 and 1/2d. to the colony plus 2d. registration.



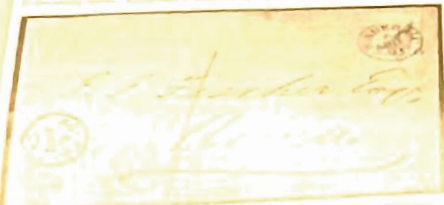

GOLD COAST
 Some offices, where numeral indices were not issued, used the brass
 seals to cancel adhesives. This 1880 cover to Milan shows the Adhesive
 seal used in this manner in conjunction with 20mm. circle (without
 day or month). Being brass they did not take ink well and were
 cancelled again '66' at Accra. 4d. rate to Italy - red 3 being
 share to the British P.O. and red 1 due to the colony.

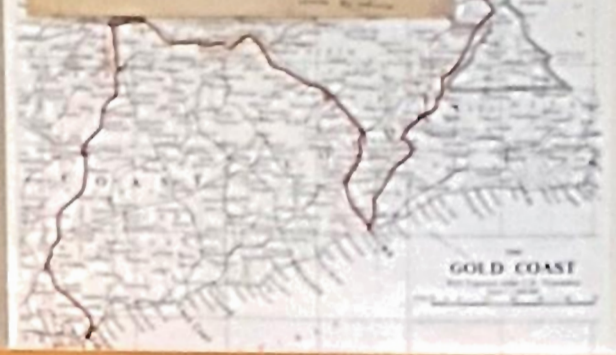

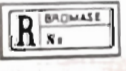
